This man's allotment has been deducted in Pay Books at rate of \$5.00 per week to close of period 3/9/15 after departure of the Battalion, from which date the relative Pay Books are kept in this Office, and also the allotment is being continued until some good reason to the contrary presents itself..

A few days before the departure of the Battalion (20/8/15) at the request of the O.C., imprests estimated by the Company Commanders as sufficient to close the Pay Period ended 3/9/15 were taken on the Transport, and which it was intended to pay out abroad. So far the Acquittance Rolls relating thereto have not been received at this Office, although in response to a telegram to the O.C. on the 9th, replied to on the 11th, it was stated that they had been forwarded. Until these come to hand I naturally cannot tell what each man has been paid.

Meanwhile it is to be assumed that unless the man's Company Commander omitted to properly complete his A.B. 64, and thereby overlooking his Allotment, a misapprehension has arisen.

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the above mentioned N.C.O. is proceeding to Newfoundland per S/s. "Sicilian" due to leave Liverpool tomorrow.

Previous reference has been made to this special repatriation, which has been delayed owing to the fact that Vail had not completed the tests for Enteric Fever. He is discharged from hospital today. His papers have not yet reached this Office, but it is assumed he will not be fit for active service for some months.

In response to Lord Rothermere's offer to carry invalid soldiers to Newfoundland free of charge, an application was made to secure a passage for Vail on the "Alconda" leaving England tomorrow. It was discovered that this ship's accommodation was fully engaged.

Vail has been paid up to and including 30/6/16.

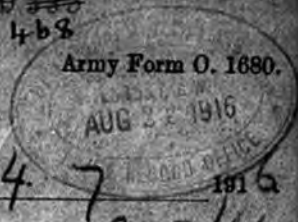

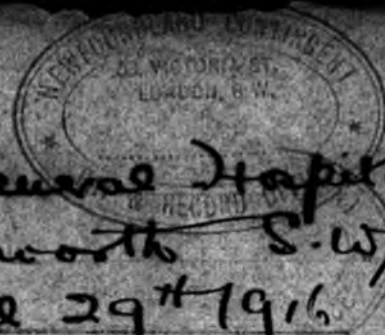

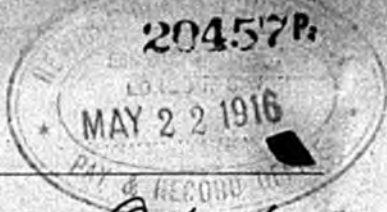
