Vaughan, being one of the very first to offer his services in the Empire's cause, left Newfoundland with the First Five Hundred and from the beginning he showed himself to be a man of sterling worth and of exemplary character. He was known by everyone in the Regiment and a favourite with all ranks: honest and straightforward in everything and always cheery and bright, one can easily understand his popularity.

In this your hour of sorrow and bereavement I feel that it will be some consolation to you to know that your husband was held in such esteem by all members of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

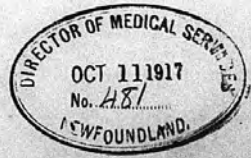

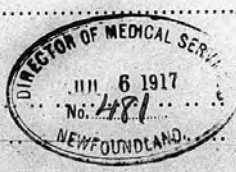
