

I enclose letter received from Lt. Wakefield, together with his cheque for £7.19.0 (seven pounds nineteen shillings). Kindly note his instructions in the matter and be good enough to return his letter to me.


Deputy Paymaster

As shown in Cash returns for July, this cheque was cleared and credited to account H.Q., St. John's, and the money is therefore at your disposal. From the outset this account has entailed a lot of attention, correspondence and trouble. Although Lt. Wakefield ceased to be with the Regiment in August 1915, he remained a Newfoundland officer until transferred to the R.A.M.C. As a matter of fact he was gazetted to his appointment in the R.A.M.C. from 12/10/15, and accordingly was entitled to draw pay & allowances from this Contingent to the 11/10/15; but having regard to the Governor's telegram of 2/10/15 to the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that date was adopted, and his pay was credited to 1/10/15.

With regard to 17/- claim: this was actually 18/- and being a travelling one was payable from Imperial funds. The Command Paymaster only allowed 15/- which amount should have been collected by Lieut. Wakefield direct, but to accommodate him it was collected through this office and paid to his Bankers.

I do not see what Lieut. Wakefield has to complain about: he had his account credited with full allowances and in addition thereto Revolver, Binoculars and Compass and a £2 gold piece, this latter at special request,

all free. These it was understood were handed him in accordance with a resolution of the Finance Committee, and in consideration of his generously ceding his pay etc to the Patriotic funds. The first Kit allowance was \$150, and when the additional \$100 was granted, value of Revolver, Binoculars and Compass was deducted as in the case of other officers, but not the \$2 piece.

Under the circumstances of his having paid £7:19:0 which he did not actually receive himself, but was paid to the Patriotic funds, it would appear that this sum which in effect is an additional contribution from him, might be paid to the two funds as before.

The net result will be that Lt. Wakefield received usual Pay, Kit, Field and Mess Allowances, plus \$2. Of this he contributed his Pay and Field Allowances in equal proportions to:



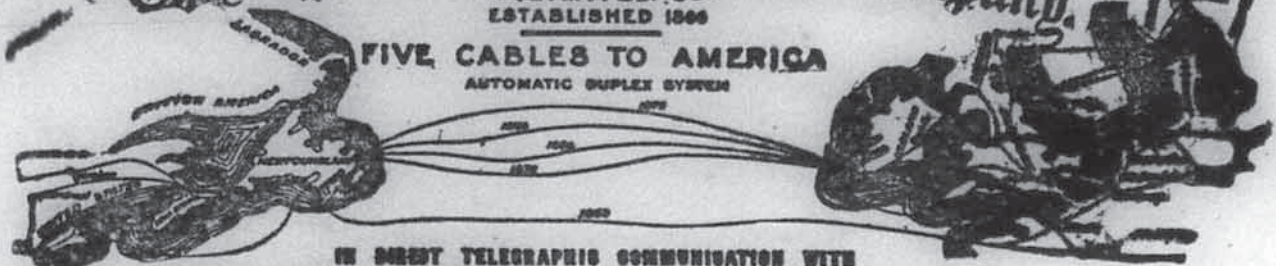



DEAR CAPTAIN TIMEWELL:-

This is to confirm officially our conversation of a few days ago, I do not want to receive any pay for my work with the Nfld Regiment, I would greatly prefer that any pay coming to me in the ordinary course of events, should not be drawn from the Government at all. If however, this course is impossible, I should be greatly obliged, if you would be so kind, as to arrange that it be paid in equal parts to the Mens' and Womens' Nfld Patriotic Funds.

The above to apply after a sufficient sum has been drawn to cover cost of revolver and binoculars, which were not allowed me, but which I should like to have; in addition to this, I should also like to have the smallest obtainable gold coin as a Souvenir to hang on my watch-chain, along with the first Sovereign I earned in the Boer War. I should be very grateful if it would not be too much trouble for you to arrange this for me.
