I wonder what the Pensions Committee will do about my allowance. The year's pension ends at the 28th Feb., and I have received my last monthly cheque. Would you ask Uncle Phil to see Sir P.T. McGrath about it. I am in my private opinion entitled to the same allowance because the arm has not appreciably improved, and in the damp weather of Edinburgh I suffer considerably from bad circulation and rheumatism up as far as the shoulder. The hand is always cold, although I continually wear two gloves upon it. The authorities may have come to a decision, but unless they send me the usual allowance on Feb. 1st, I shall be in a bad corner.

MEMO.

Dr. Bert O'Reilly, just back from McGill University, queried as to costs of medical course in connection with J.A. Walsh's application for vocational re-education looking to his undertaking the practise of medicine, states as follows:

McGill has a five-year course. Walsh is mistaken in supposing that the time he spent in the drug business will take a year off its course. The most it will do is relieve him from a three months' term of dispensing in the dispensary. The cost of fees for the first four years is \$174 annually, and for the fifth year \$204, or an average of \$180 a year. His board and lodging will represent \$35 a month or \$420 a year. Books, instruments, etc., will average \$40 a year; and then clothing, pocket money, etc., will add to the amount according as he wishes to spend. In his opinion Walsh would need at least \$700 a year to put him through. He adds, too, that unless a student enters in September next it will be a six-year course thereafter, but he says five-year courses still prevail, he thinks, at Toronto, Kingston, and at Dalhousie.

You may recall my conversation with you in which you agreed to assist us, by your advice, in dealing with the cases of men who are applicants for vocational re-education. The bearer, Private J. A. Walsh, was recently discharged after having been retired by the Medical Board with fifty percent disability. He served some time as a druggist in this city and is anxious to take a course in medicine. He says that Sir John Bland-Sutton, an English doctor, advised him that his disability would not affect him in pursuing his medical studies, because he could specialize in some branch of medicine. I shall be glad, therefore, if you will kindly look him over and give us your opinion respecting this in order that the Pension Board may be able to determine to what, if any, extent we can assist him.


