Dear Sir; - I am in receipt of your letter dated february 22 nd. answering mire of January 31st concerning my discharge papers and money awing to me. you say that the paymasters department inform you that they have fowarded the sam of \$100.00. of my wages and \$60.00. clothing allowance. But sir I have not received any such money. If your letter is the only thing I have received from the military authorities since I was sent home. It seems a rather curious affair about this. I have consulted the postmaster about it, he says there have been no such letter come for me.

I think there must have been a mistake made, or the thing overlooked. because my discharge papers was to be sent the 30 eth of november 1918: as well as my money, and I have not seceived lither yet. as this is a matter as importance to me. I was to before the medical board at the brilitia department about the middle of the same month and sent home. being medically unfit for servace. I enlisted June the 7 inth and caught the measels at the barricks in st Johns and was taken down with with them while on home leaf and followed by a severe attack of Bronco Ruemnmonia

which rendered me unfit for Servace as stated before. I was told at the militia department in november when I was sent home, that my Dapers. and the money due me would be Sent me about the last of the same month, and I have been waiting ener since and have not received any thing yet. the greater part of my wages since I enlisted is due me, and also the money which is given for a suit of clothes now.
