Sir,

I beg to say that yesterday I was called to St. Hyacinth for the purpose of apprehending one Pte. William Whittle of that place who at the time was terrorizing the inhabitants of that settlement; by acting in a most disorderly manner breaking windows and firing guns in every direction.

His mother also informed me that she was obliged to remove a child of this year, from the house the previous night as Whittle threatened to kill the boy who is his step-brother.

I may add that Whittle was placed in the Caymans for the insane about four weeks ago and only arrived here last week after being discharged from that institution, and I find from enquiries made that he was even worse when he arrived than prior to being taken from here four or five weeks ago.

I managed to take charge of this man after considerable trouble as owing to having no Constables here or appearance of any kind such as straight jacket etc for dealing with such cases. and gave him in charge of two men to convey him to Placentia to be delivered up to a Regular Police Officer who I instructed to take him to St. John's.
