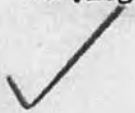

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a cablegram from the Record Office, London, intimating that your nephew, Private William Whittle, had Died of Acute Nephritis, at the 35th General Hospital, Calais, on the 14th inst.

Permit me to express on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy with you at this time. While we all sorrow at the loss of loved one, yet it will no doubt be some consolation to you to think that your nephew loyally answered the call of King and Country, fought bravely and well and fell with his face to the foe in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. He has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare and now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, His name will be emblazoned upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the Victory has been won and Peace again reigns it will be a comfort to you to think that, in this great achievement, your gallant nephew bore no small part, and gave of himself even to the uttermost.
