Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

As the representative of the G.W.P. in this place I consider it my duty to write you again concerning no. 49.97 ex Private Wiseman who as I stated before contracted measles while in the Army which later brought on T.B.

In your letter to me re this matter you said that a medical statement was necessary before his case could be considered by the Board. I brought the matter before our local M.D. who it seems was very slow in submitting same as it was only recently that Wiseman was informed that it was considered that he had contracted measles while at Home, which

is not the case as he was sick with them the night he came home on leave.

I do not see how that would make any difference anyway as he was still in the Army, and likely would not have been at home then, if he had not been in U. S. Forces.

I hope that the Pensions Board will give his case every consideration, as his is a case of real disability which I believe should be considered just as much as if he were wounded.

Replying to your letter of September 5th., regarding the case of ~~Ex-Private~~ Garland wiseman.

wiseman was in the regiment a very short period, he had measles when at home on furlough in 1918, so that I would be glad if you would give me further information. why you think the tubercular spine was indirectly caused during the time of his enlistment. we cannot take into consideration a possibility of this being due to his illness during his enlistment, but only if it is a probability, and ⁱⁿ giving this opinion, one has to consider his length of service, any illness during service, and the time which has elapsed since his demobilization.
